

## The Timing of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ

This illustration outlines the timing, sequence, Holy Days, and relevant details of the death and resurrection of Messiah in 30 CE. It is based entirely upon Scripture. The 5 keys are: 1) Christ gave the Sign of Jonah as proof he is the Son of God; Mt. 12:40. 2) When Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread fell on the week of Christ's death and resurrection. 3) That certain women prepared Christ's burial spices before a Sabbath but purchased them after a Sabbath (Mk. 16:1 & Lk. 23:54-56). 4) The Biblical beginning and end of the day. 5) Two disciples walking to Emmaus, unwittingly joined by Christ, are sad thinking he did not rise as it was the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the week - the **day after** the Sign of Jonah was to be fulfilled.

Only the year 30 CE correlates with a New Moon (conjunction) that allows Passover to fall after the Spring Equinox, with the timing of the events of Christ's death matching scripture.

* Days begin and end at dark, not at midnight as in the Roman system, nor around sunset as with the Jewish traditions (Gen. 1:5; Jos. 2:5; 2Chr. 35:14; Neh. 4:21; 13:19, 22; Isa. 30:29; Mt. 14:15; Jn. 20:1, 19).																	

### Description of Daily Events

3	Tuesday	During the afternoon and early evening the disciples prepare for the Passover Festival. After dark on the 14 <sup>th</sup> day of the 1 <sup>st</sup> Month (Nissan/Abib), Jesus Christ introduces the New Covenant Passover symbols at the Lord's Supper. These new symbols replace the OT symbols for Passover. This night Jesus is betrayed and arrested.
4	Wednesday	Messiah is nailed to a tree (3586 Gk. <i>xylon</i> - Ac. 5:30; 10:39; 13:29; RSV, BBE, ERV, YLT, ESV; NKJV, NIV, ISV, ASV) at the time the Passover lambs are sacrificed in the Temple. Jesus dies and is buried just before dark, before the 1 <sup>st</sup> Day of Unleavened Bread begins. This is a "High Day" an annual Sabbath.
5	Thursday	At dark, the 1 <sup>st</sup> Day of Unleavened Bread ends. (All Holy Days are Sabbaths or High Days; (Ex. 31:13; Lev. 23:27-32; 26:2; Ez. 20:20; 44:24; Jn. 19:31).
6	Friday	The women purchase burial spices after the annual Sabbath, on the preparation day and prepare them the same day, before the weekly Sabbath (Mk. 16:1; Lk. 23:54-56).
7	Saturday	Before dark at the end of the Sabbath, exactly three days and three nights after Christ's burial, he is raised from the dead by his God and Father (Jn. 20:17; Ac. 5:30).
1	Sunday	"As it was yet dark" on the first day of the week, Mary & the women find the tomb empty. Two disciples, unaware of Christ's resurrection, are sad, thinking he hadn't risen as Sunday was the day after "the third day since all these things occurred." Easter (Ez. 8:15-16) is thus proven false (Lk. 24:21; RNT, cf. Nestle-Aland GNT, 27 <sup>th</sup> Ed).
